

"Freely you have received, freely (Matthew 10:8)

The role of the church is simply this: to bless the world. (Reggie McNeal, Missional Renaissance)

We don't know exactly what heaven looks like, but we do know that in the middle of the New Jerusalem there is a river - the river of the water of life, as clear as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb down the middle of the great street of the city. (Revelation 22:12)

All throughout Scripture the river is a powerful picture of the abundant life God offers all people through His Son Jesus and the Holy Spirit. As the angel said to the prophet Ezekiel, where the river flows everything will live. (Ezekiel 47:9)

When Jesus first spoke about the lifesustaining Holy Spirit, he talked about a river: "Whoever believes in me, streams of living water will flow from within him." (John 7:38) A river is an appropriate image for the Christian life because it's always moving and never stagnant. There is a flowing in and a flowing out. We're supposed to be rivers, not lakes. Streams of living water will flow, not, lakes of stagnant water

will accumulate. That's why the Dead Sea is dead – nothing flowing in or out. That's why dead churches are dead – nothing coming in, nothing going out.

When Jesus sent his disciples out on their first mission he used the language of a river: Freely vou have received, freely give. His life had flowed into them and now he was telling them to let it flow out. The life we've received from Jesus is meant to be shared - not just with each other, but also with our community. We've been talking about reaching our community. To effectively do this, we must freely receive in order to freely give. The Holy Spirit is constantly flowing like a river. How much are we receiving? And how much of what we are receiving are we giving away?

Elsewhere in this newsletter you will find a lovely poem by Sue Paulus. The last stanza perfectly captures what Jesus commanded his followers:

> Keep the Living Water flowing Pour out everything He has blessed you with Drink deep

> > Drink in and pour out

Others need to see Him through you.

God has blessed us and also commanded us to be a blessing. We who trust in Jesus have received and continue to receive living water. This gift of life is not meant to collect in one place, but to constantly flow out.

# Scrapbook for the Gutman Family





It's been wonderful to see so many of you. We often marvel at the blessing that friends and family are to us, and we pray we can be encouragers to you all, too.

Let us catch you up on what's been going on: Our support for returning to the Philippines is currently just \$60 below the amount we have been asked to raise.

Ron's computer problem turned out to be terminal, but we thank the Lord for putting us in touch with a Christian brother who was able to help get us set up with a new one.

Our family (kids and grandchildren) had a wonderful time together for four days in July. We have to

Due to some concerns with our aging car (which just turned over 200,000), we have regretfully felt led to cancel our trip to the West Coast. We really feel bad for not seeing you out there; thank you for understanding.

We have just finished packing a couple big boxes of mostly commentaries for the translators in the Philippines to use, plus a few of our personal items. Please pray that these boxes can be sent safely and arrive in a timely manner.

Please pray for our travel in the next few days through Ohio, Michigan, Wisconsin, Minnesota, South Dakota and back to Nebraska where we'll be with Donna's mom for about five weeks. During our time in Nebraska we hope to catch up on some of our translation responsibilities that have gotten pushed to the back burner.

Thank you for your concerns for Scott Burton's health, which continues up and down Many of you have been praying for him and asking for updates. Ask the Lord to give health and wisdom for the progress they need to finalize the translation of the gospel of John and 1 Corinthians.
