Out of the Saltshaker...

It was he who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers, to prepare God's people ... so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all ... become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ. (Ephesians 4:11-13)

Jesus died on the cross not just so people who believe in him can go to heaven when they leave the earth, but also so that they can become like him while they're on the earth. He said this very clearly in Luke 6:40—**Everyone who is fully trained will be like his teacher.** He said the same thing in John 14:12—**Anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing.**

In last month's newsletter, I concluded my column this way: *The measuring stick [for our church] is not numbers but health. And the essence of health is likeness to Jesus Christ.* When people in the church get intentional about becoming like Jesus, EVERYTHING is affected: worship, fellowship, evangelism, service, Christian education, missions, even finances.


How do we measure likeness to Jesus? The best place to start is the fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23): **Love, peace, joy, patience, kindness, faithfulness, goodness, gentleness and self-control.** Jesus said, **I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit.** (John 15:16, italics added) That's our main assignment. It's right in line with the Great Commission: **Go and make disciples.** (Matthew 28:19)

Only disciples can make disciples. People who don't know Jesus come to know him mostly through other people—people who are committed to becoming like Jesus, people who bear the fruit of the Spirit. The fruit that brings the most glory to God is a life that has been changed: a non-Christian coming to Jesus, a Christian becoming more like Jesus.

Colossians 1:6 says, **All over the world this gospel is bearing fruit and growing, just as it has been doing among you since the day you heard it and understood God's grace in all**

its truth. May it be so for our congregation; may it be so for all the churches in Paulding! More on this later Shalom.

If He lays it on your heart to continue praying for these people’s salvation, that would be wonderful.






A portion of Dr. Tony Evans prayer for our nation:
