OUT OF THE SALTSHAKER: Which Comes First, the Children or the Nursery?

There are a couple of familiar verses in Matthew about children: "Let the little children come to me and forbid them not, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." and "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me." There is also a church corollary to the ageold chicken or the egg question: Which comes first, the children or the nursery? That question has actually recently been answered!

The NURSERY needs to come first, and plans are underway for our nursery to re-open for ages infant to 5 year olds on Sunday, Sept. 10th when fall schedule resumes.

Two people... a teen and a grandma (or mom!)..... will be in the nursery during worship, from 10 am until the last child is picked up. Even if there is no child downstairs at 10:15, these volunteers will be in place in case someone becomes restless and needs to come to the nursery partway through the service. There is no intention to 'ban' children from the sanctuary..... they are indeed very welcome. The idea is to ease the stress for parents and to give them options. (See a fuller article elsewhere in this newsletter.)

Now, as Paul Harvey used to say on the radio, here is the REST of the story! Back in February, I had, well, a vision.....no angels, no music, no blinding lights, but a vision, for lack of a better term ... that 5 families, possibly including our new pastor's family, would be coming to our church in September. My first thought was...... WOW! And then.... REALLY? And then.....somebody needs to do something. And then ... well, YOU are Somebody. And finally Don't doubt that this can be true. Instead, claim that it IS true.

So, I started to share this grand dream with the Christian Ed elder, Rhonda, and with Session, and during 'prayer for our church' on Wednesday mornings, and with church friends. It has been amazing to watch the whole idea begin to unfold..... hmmm... probably a God Event! The next step seemed to be "Get the nursery open".

Lots of little and big confirmations about needing the nursery arose over the next weeks and months:

*In April, while I was in the church kitchen being the 'coffee hostess' for the Is This the Time? coach training, I heard the speaker out in the fellowship hall say, "What would happen if 5 families came to your church

this fall? Would you be ready?" Almost my exact words!

*Jeff and Sherie announced they were expecting little Zane in September.....confirmation!

*Rhonda's granddaughter
Autumn has been in church pretty regularly, and Crafts and Nices and Clines and Crosslands have visiting grandkids ,.....they might want to use a nursery!

*And now, 6 months after this

conviction was first laid on my heart, a pastoral candidate with a little baby visited last weekend! Whether Ian is 'the one' who becomes our pastor or not it feels like more confirmation!

I invite everyone to join me in anticipating new families coming, and claiming the promise of new families. There are surely more things we will need and want to do to be ready for children. Opening the nursery in September is a big start in that direction.

And I ask all you grandmas and moms to consider coming to the shower on Aug. 12 and to volunteer to serve alongside a teen in the nursery one Sunday this fall. (See separate article about the nursery inside.)

Property Committee Seeking Funds


It was decided at the congregational meeting in May to continue to seek funds for the new garage. This will keep the church from having to use a lot of money from the Nicelly Fund.

Nursery News

As you read on the front page, and heard in worship a couple of weeks ago, plans are underway to have our nursery open for children infants through 5 years old, starting Sept. 10th when fall schedule resumes. Here is a little about how this is intended to look:

Two people... a teen and a grandma (or mom!).... will be in the nursery during worship, from 10 am until the last child is picked up. Parents will sign their child in, and pick their child back up. Parents will leave their cell phone number so that they can be texted during worship if they need to return to the nursery before the

service is over. Children can be brought to the nursery anytime during worship.

Four teens (Erin, Anna, Kristen, Julia) have committed to being in the nursery one Sunday per month......someone on the 1st, Sunday, the 2nd Sunday, etc. The teen's job will be to interact and love on the kids, and also to provide the physical labor for the day.....boosting a 2 year old for a diaper change, taking a 4 year old to the bathroom, getting up and down and up and down, picking up all the toys at the end.

The grandma/mom will also love on the kids..... talking, coloring, reading books, playing with toys, cuddling, rocking babies but will not need to do physical labor! What a plan! Each of you out there know your abilities and your limitations. It is hoped that, if you feel able and are willing, you will commit to serve one Sunday between September and New Years in the nursery.
