UPDATE. PASTOR SEARCH COMMITTEE.

The survey work is done, the Church Information Form is on-line, we even have the information filed with one seminary. And...four people have already responded!

We have quickly let the four applicants know we received their materials.

Next is to carefully review the information they submitted and, when appropriate, to contact references. Reading about their beliefs, experience and education will help us know more about each person.

This process of calling a new pastor has allowed us to learn more about how the EPC denomination directs and assists the process.

It is a given that our new pastor must currently be ordained or eligible for ordination. In the EPC, the governing body that approves a candidate as having appropriate training and beliefs is the Presbytery. The EPC is divided into a number of Presbyteries with more being created as the denomination grows. The Presbytery reviews the candidate going so far as to question the candidate in public at a Presbytery meeting even if the individual already serves as an EPC pastor in a different Presbytery.

This process provides great help to our congregation as we know that a higher body has deemed a final candidate as theologically appropriate. Once ordained by our Presbytery, our church will be able to install the individual.

You may find it interesting that the EPC

identifies three categories of elders. First, a ruling elder is one who is currently serving on Session and has been ordained by our own church to do so. Second, 'once an elder, always an elder,' as the title continues even after the term ends. The third category is teaching elder, the EPC title for a pastor.

As Christians we believe in the power of prayer. Our committee is composed of seven regular people from our congregation. Now that the call is out to the world, and people are responding, we seven need your prayers to help us discern, to hear from God to whom we should respond. Thank you.

Each of us on the Pastor Search Committee appreciate the ideas we have heard from so many people. Please feel free to contact any of us with ideas and questions.

Session Highlights

At the March 21st Session meeting, elders:

*started the meeting by hearing from Sue Paulus about a county-wide revival-type event that is being planned by IGNITE-Paulding on July 16-19. Entitled "Is This the Time?", the event will be held at Wayne Trace High School, and has the support of 30+ area churches. Sue is our church's contact to this group and this event. See article regarding the event and upcoming training on page 5 of this newsletter.

*heard that David Meriwether's name has been added to the plaque of pastors who have served our church over time.

*agreed to order the newest Book of Order from EPC.

*learned that the church van has been gone over by St John Tire. Brakes and tires have been updated, and the van has been deep-cleaned inside and out.

*signed the Commitment form to prayerfully support the "Is This the Time?" event.

*approved the April schedule of pulpit supply provided by the Worship Committee; and asked them to proceed with filling the pulpit for May.

*approved use of the Fellowship Hall on Mon., May 8 by the Bargain Bin for their Annual Member Luncheon; and by the Gideons Auxiliary on Sat., Aug. 5th for a regional meeting.

*approved a bid for summer yard maintenance with Classic Land Design (Randy Bostelman) for \$65 per mowing occurrence. This company, which is the same group that does our winter snow removal, will also trim bushes and refresh mulch per agreement with the Property Committee.

*the Property Committee continues to keep many items on their radar....the new garage and its placement, tree removal on Cherry St, work needed in the cottage laundry room, security at the church, replacement of lighting with LED over time, and plaster troubles in the sanctuary. No final answers have been reached at this time.

Fellowship During Lent





("Seder" is the name for the Passover meal and it literally means "order", because the Passover follows a very specific order of service). Perhaps you could let the people of your congregation know about this special Jews for Jesus service, and they can promote this wonderful event
