One of my favorite Psalms is 103. Last year when Larry experienced a life-threatening illness I read it over and over, sometimes praying the words aloud. "Praise the LORD, O my soul; all my inmost being, praise his holy name. Praise the LORD, O my soul and forget none of his benefits."

This month, as we prepare to celebrate Father's Day together on June 18. I am more mindful than ever of the abundant and amazing benefits our Faithful Father, God, bestows on his children. In the Good Book we see who God is and what he does. In the Gospel of John, Jesus and His Father are supreme examples of an intimate, tender relationship. In the Garden of Gethsemane Jesus cried out, "Abba, Daddy." Pointing to Jesus, John wrote, "No one has seen God at any time. The only begotten Son who is in the bosom of the Father. He has made Him known." It is noteworthy that a good father reflects the love of the heavenly Father.

But, what does fatherhood have to do with the worship experience of Psalm 103? Let's not forget His benefits, blessing and favor mentioned in the passage:

- He forgives your sins every one
- He heals your diseases every one
- He redeems you from hell saves your life
- He crowns you with love and mercy a paradise crown
- He wraps you in goodness beauty eternal
- He renews your youth you're always young in his presence. MSG

Billy Graham wrote in regard to our earthly dads: "A good father is one of the most unsung, un-praised, unnoticed and yet one of the most valuable assets to our society."

For many of us, our biological father is not alive to celebrate his special day with us. For others the reminder of recovery from illness and the restoration of health is foremost in our minds. In view of that, let's celebrate our Heavenly Father's provision by lifting up our earthly fathers in their roles as leader, lover, provider, and protector of their families, affirming their place in God's order.

Dads, may the blessing of the LORD be upon you and your household.

At the May meeting, elders:

*met with Jeff Summers to address staffing of the computer/ sound system on Sundays. Joe Reineck and Jeff do the lion's share of this job, and wonderfully! It is hoped that 2-3 more folks can be trained, hands on, by Joe and Jeff. These folks would then rotate on a set schedule, often enough to remember what was learned! Sound like your 'thing'? *toured the back bathroom in the cottage with Dan and Alex Straley to see the progress on this much-needed project. Paint and flooring were approved. Straleys also walked us around the site flags for the new garage to show the proposed placement. Elders approved the placement as staked out. Dan and Alex are meeting with AEP about possible moving of a pole along the alley. Construction may begin as soon as 10 days. Funds are still needed to minimize the draw from the Nicelley fund.

*heard that the tree project (several removed, several trimmed, stumps ground down) is complete. The proposed security system is still in the scheduling stage.

*approved Pastor Dan Young's sermon series, to be preached throughout June, based on the letter he shared with us all. We are so grateful to Pastor Dan and Marilyn for their warm care for our congregation.

*heard that Isaac and Harry will lead praise singing most Sundays; and that elders (and others) will be sharing a favorite scripture and why it is meaningful to them during worship this summer. The Worship committee was asked to consider how we might organize our worship service a bit better to leave more time for our speakers this summer.

*approved donating \$500 to the Beautiful Feet celebration this summer, pending discussion by the full Mission committee.

*expressed appreciation for deacons Brent Fishbaugh and Jane Nice for serving as the 'visitor' deacons during April and May.

*supported a prayer vigil for Mara Vielma's safe return, Thurs., May 25th from 3 - 7:00 pm in our church.

*heard that early registration for General Assembly in June in California ends May 31st. No one from our church will be attending this year.

*asked the Worship committee to proceed with filling the pulpit for July and August from our strong rotation of pastors.... our 'regulars' Dan Young, Pastor Dwayne, Dave McMaster, as well as Vinnie Kroterfeld, Dwight Stoller, Doug Roop, Mike Zeedyk, and Steve Heilshorn.

Nightly worship provided by the Beautiful Feet Worship team, led by Miranda Harris.



If you live out of town, feel free to come after the service. But do so knowing that you may be put to work!


