Session Highlights November and December

During November and December, elders:

*okayed, at the recommendation of the Property committee, re-routing the <u>plumbing</u> in the bathrooms/kitchen to get it out from under the Fellowship Hall, at a cost of approximately \$7000. Funds will come from the Nicelley income or investment funds.

*are exploring <u>internet</u> upgrade. At minimum, there are plans to switch carriers from Windstream to either Metalink or Spectrum.

*heard that <u>cottage items</u> have been moved now that Fergusons are using the cottage for their home. Some are in the new garage, and some in Nice's shop.

*learned that two <u>5th Quarters</u> are scheduled during basketball season, and that the school, our partner churches, and the VFW are again supporting this activity for Paulding teens.

*heard that church <u>Christmas</u> <u>ornaments, plates and mugs</u> (discovered in the cottage attic) will be offered by the Historical committee for a freewill donation during December. Funds received will be used to renovate a stained glass window (also discovered!) for display in the church. The display is in the Fellowship Hall.

*set the date for the Annual Congregational Meeting for Sunday, Jan., 28, 2018 with a meal to follow.

*approved the <u>2018 budget</u> of \$130,629, pending approval at the January Annual Meeting.

*learned that the <u>church locks</u> have all been keyed to one key; and that the <u>cottage locks</u> have been changed, as it is now the Fergusons' residence.

*were delighted to hear that <u>Pastor Ian had a Skype inter-</u> <u>view</u> with Steve Brown, chair of the Presbytery's Ministerial committee, to preview questions he will face when he is examined on the floor of Presbytery. Steve Brown deemed him 'rock solid' and foresees no problem.

*expressed considerable frustration at the hold-up on Pastor Ian's psychological test results, despite efforts by our Session and by the Candidate Care committee of Midwest Presbytery. This cork in the dam is holding up other steps needed toward ordination for our new pastor. Elders, with Ian's agreement, have approved Ian to establish an appointment with a Midwest examiner to be re-tested at the earliest possible time, with the church bearing this new expense.

*learned that Pastor Ian and Pastor Dan Young have discussed a <u>mentor relationship</u>, and both are enthused at the possibilities. *approved <u>Gideon use of the</u> <u>kitchen and Fellowship Hall</u> on Sunday, Feb. 25 for Rally Sunday.

*were reminded that <u>Lent be-</u> <u>gins on Wed., Feb. 14</u> and will again involve Community lunches and church suppers for 6 consecutive Wednesdays.

*learned that there have been <u>more boiler problems</u>. Although the situation has been repaired for now, the day is coming in the next year or two when the parts for the boiler will no longer be available. Plans will need to be made to deal with this coming major expense.

*<u>thanked Phyllis Lutz for her</u> <u>service on Session</u>. Phyllis is completing her duties at the end of 2017, and has additionally served several previous stints as an elder. Thank you, Phyllis!

News from Ron & Donna — January 2018

<u>You Prayed—God Answered</u> Thank you for praying for us during the week of December 18 as we worked with people from two languages on alphabet, glossary, and basic grammar. God gave us

<u>Devastation in Davao City</u> That same storm caused the Davao River to overflow its banks less than a half mile from where we live, and the homes of four employees of Faith International Academy (which adjoins the SIL property) were flooded. Thousands of families in this city have lost their homes, and over 300 are dead or missing. That same day, a young woman whom we know from one of the cultural communities where SIL has worked was almost caught in the fire that burned down a large shopping mall here. She worked in the call center where 38 were trapped and died. By God's grace she had not yet reported for work that day. However, the daughter of a local pastor was among the victims. The city is still reeling from these catastrophes. Pray that God will be somehow bring good out of this as His people help and share with those affected.

<u>Assignment in Thailand</u> On January 18 we leave for Thailand, where we will spend four weeks helping to train translation consultants from many countries, including one from another Asian country whom we knew at Nasuli years ago when he was helping with a new translation for his own language!

Dear Friends in the Lord,

God has been dealing with me (and hopefully, with you) in how I have been giving financially to our church. He gave me what I think is a good idea and I would like to share it with each of you.

My thinking, when I saw that our budgeted giving was over \$9,000 behind at the end of July, was "The piddlin' little amount that I could give wouldn't put a dent in that deficit."
