Alissa and I want to thank everyone who prayed for my floor examination at presbytery. It was very encouraging to having some of you come to presbytery. While I was being peppered with questions, it was so good to see members of the church in the crowd cheering me on.


Some of you who were not there have asked what I thought about the examination questions. You may have heard of the father who asked his son about his test. The father asked, "How were your exam questions?" The boy replied "The exam questions were easy. The answers were the problem." In all seriousness, it went well and I am glad all my exams (written, committee, and floor) are behind me. Since I have now been approved for ordination in the Evangelical Presbyterian church (EPC), we will be having an ordination ceremony and celebration on March 18th, 6:00pm, at Paulding First Presbyterian church. Everyone is invited.

As I have reflected on my ordination process and all the questions I have been asked, something occurred to me. After hours of rigorous questions before committees and presbytery and hours of grueling written exams, I believe that I was never asked about one topic: evangelism. Of course, this is an important topic for our denomination. "Evangelism" is listed as one of the essentials of the faith for the EPC and it is referred to in our name "Evangelical Presbyterian Church".

Point seven in our *Essentials of the Faith* reads, "The Lord Jesus Christ commands all believers to proclaim the Gospel throughout the world and to make disciples of all nations. Obedience to the Great Commission requires total commitment to "Him who loved us and gave Himself for us."

We must not forget that evangelism is essential in our life as a Jesus follower. The life of Billy Graham is a powerful example of this. As we learned of this death this week (2/21/2018), Graham's legacy stands as a reminder. Graham understood that people need a clear presentation of the gospel. They need Jesus as their Lord and Savior. Jesus gave His followers the Great Commission to go and make disciples, baptizing them and teaching them all of what Jesus has commanded (Matt 28:19-20). Billy Graham should be praised for keeping the main thing the main thing.

As I start my time of serving God as pastor here at First Presbyterian Church of Paulding, I will seek to not forget "evangelism" even if I am not asked about it.

Session Highlights January

At the Feb. Session meeting, elders:

*congratulated Pastor Ian on his successful examination at Presbytery, where he not only 'passed', but presented himself very well. Session also thanked the 13 people from our congregation who attended the meeting to support Ian.

*approved the date of Sun., March 18 at 6 pm for Ian's ordination ceremony at our church. (See separate article). Ian's dad, Matt Ferguson was approved to preach that day, both morning and evening, and to baptize Samuel that morning.

*okayed withdrawal of \$8588.63 from the Nicelley Investment Fund to cover water repairs in the church building and erase a deficit from the garage replacement fund.

*noted the generosity of two contractors.....Doug Schlatter for not charging to connect the water fountains, and Jay Dangler for not charging for the sewer excavation at the cottage to resolve a clog.

*heard from Property that the ballasts in the the parking lot street lights are being replaced. Also, that two items are 'out there' to be addressed in the longer-term....the aging boilers, and the deteriorating south wall.

*learned that the Personnel committee had its first

monthly get-together with Pastor Ian, which went well. Jeff Summers has agreed to serve on this committee in addition to Bud Koenig and Dave Nice.

*approved a repeat of the successful giftcard drive to stock the reward basket for Judge Beckman's Drug Court.

*agreed to allow Sue Paulus, on behalf of the Worship and Congregational Life committees to set a date with Brad Hurtig, motivational speaker (and Bill's nephew) this fall for a youth event. More information will be coming once a date has been secured; the broad picture is a joint event with the school and the church, perhaps on a 5th Quarter night. Stay tuned.

*reserved the Fellowship Hall on Sat., June 2, 2018 for Anna Karlstadt's graduation party.




