Thoughts from Ian...

2 Corinthians 5:20 "So we are Christ's ambassadors; God is making his appeal through us. We speak for Christ when we plead, 'Come back to God!"

Have you ever felt like you are being watched? Maybe it was while you were out shopping or while you were eating at Past Time café. Maybe it was while you were finishing your donut at Susie's Bakery and you felt your spouse's eyes on you to see if you were going share. I have felt this feeling often (and I share!).

This last year, I have felt another set of eyes on me. Those are the eyes of our son, Samuel. His ever watchful gaze often amazes me. He catches little things that Alissa and I do around the house after observing it one or two times. If I wear a dust mask to sweep up in the basement, he needs to wear the mask when he journey's down into the basement. If mom bravely kills a spider on the ceiling, Samuel reenacts the battle for weeks after. As new parents, we have learned that there are little eyes always watching what we do.

This is true to a greater extent for all of us because the world is watching. In 2 Corinthians 5:20, Paul reminded the Christians in Corinth that their city's eyes were on them. Because of this, they were to be ambassadors for Jesus. Again in 1 Thessalonians 4:11-12, Christians are reminded to lead a quiet life, working hard, so that they may win the respect of others. The world is watching.

William J. Toms said "Be careful how you live. You may be the only Bible some person ever reads." How much truer is this for Christians today? We are more connected than we have ever been. The internet and social media have made it so much of our lives are on display for others to see at an extent that would have floored the Apostle Paul. The call to Christians remains the same. The eves of this community are on us and so we should live lives as God's ambassadors. Our behavior is no longer about ourselves but about Jesus. Our lives should not just reflect what we are comfortable with but what God's kingdom values. We don't need to obsess about telling the world how good we are and what we have done. Even a quiet life will win the respect of others because the world is watching.

Realizing that I am being watched has changed my behavior. This isn't a bad thing. I am more careful about what I watch on the television while Samuel is around. I make sure to leave a portion of my dessert aside for my wife. And I remember that our community is watching to see if our church loves them like Jesus does. When we understand that others are watching, we will remember that we may be the only Bible some people will ever read. Most Americans have read relatively little of the Bible but most Americans have known a Christian.

Maybe you don't often feel like someone is watching you. I am glad! My goal is not to make you paranoid. Instead, I hope that we remember our responsibility to be salt and light in the world. The world is watching and it may surprise you to learn how much influence you have in the lives of those around you.

Per Member Asking

Each year, our church supports our presbytery (Presbytery of the Midwest) and our denomination (Evangelical Presbyterian Church) in the form of a per member asking. Our church provides for the total requested amount in our annual budget in support of our governing bodies. If members on the active membership list of our church are able/willing to pay their own per member asking, that amount is replaced into our own church's General Fund.

The amount of the per member asking for 2019 is \$36 per person. Of that amount, \$23 goes to the denomination, and \$13 goes to the presbytery. If you use giving envelopes, there is a blue envelope in your box for this purpose. If you don't use envelopes but are willing to pay your share, simply write Per Member Asking on the memo line of your check. Thank you.


